WHAT IS INDIGENOUS VOICES?

Indigenous Voices is an educational resource for students aged 12–17, shaped by Indigenous educators, Elders, and Knowledge Keepers from First Nations, Métis, and Inuit communities across Canada.

A shared learning journey

- **Facilitator Guide:** built for educators navigating complex content;
- **4 Intro Activities:** creating a shared foundation for learning;
- **13 Learning Pathways:** film clips, activities, discussion questions, and sharing circles;
- **ReconciliAction:** concrete, community-rooted opportunities concluding each pathway.

Through this journey, students can be expected to:

- **Think critically** about the history, culture, and contemporary realities of Indigenous Peoples in Canada;
- **Engage meaningfully** with Indigenous storytelling, art, film, and knowledge systems;
- **Turn awareness into action** with the tools to contribute to reconciliation in their own communities.
